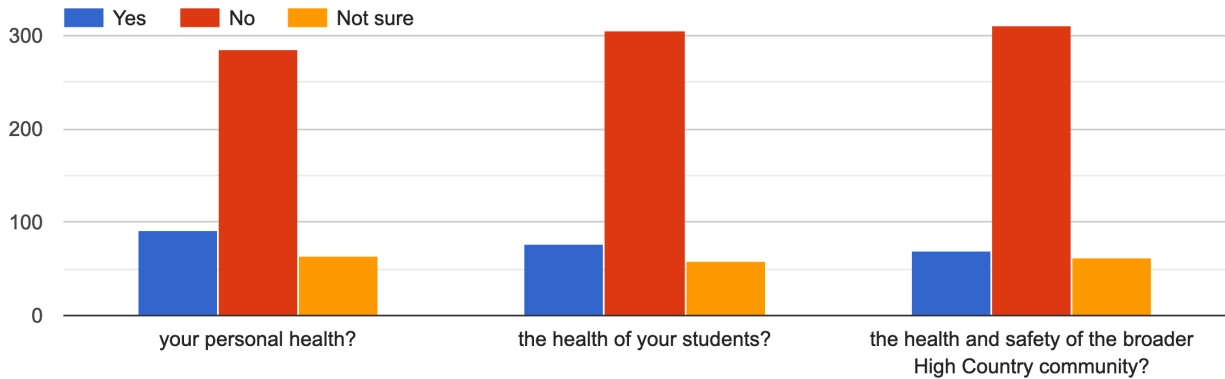


App State Faculty Covid Survey–January 2022 Summary of Responses

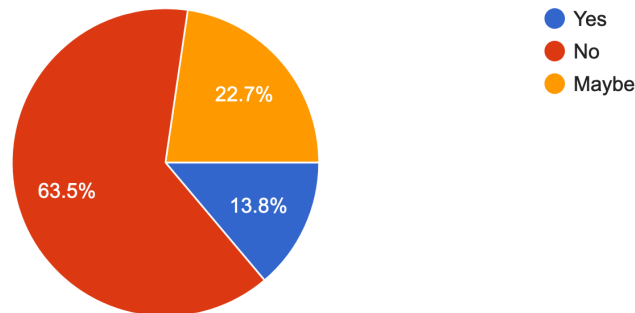

Do you believe App State's current Covid protocols adequately protect...



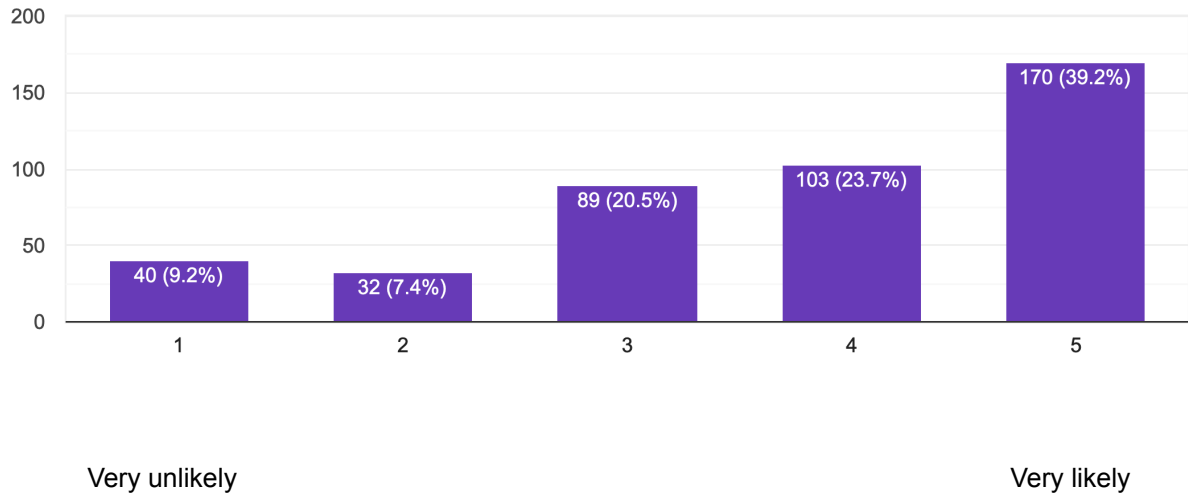

Requiring proof of vaccination or a negative PCR test for admission to all on-campus events	346 (81.4%)
Requiring use of KN95, N95, or KF94 masks in all university buildings	265 (62.4%)
Allowing faculty members full control over classroom organization and mode of delivery, including the flexibility to change these in response to emerging pandemic trends	349 (82.1%)
Developing improved contact tracing and quarantining systems	288 (67.6%)
Requiring more regular testing for all unvaccinated/unboosted students, faculty, and staff	341 (80.2%)
